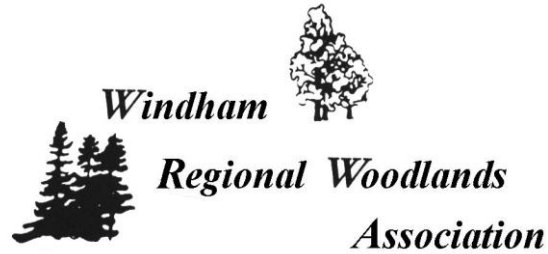

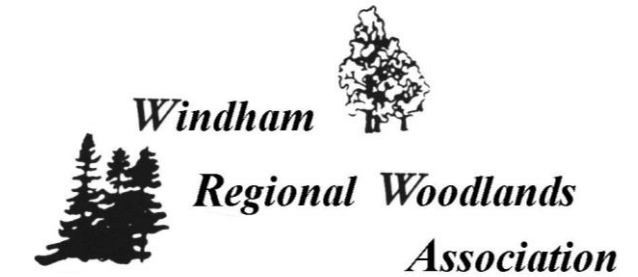

Windham Regional Woodlands Association (WRWA) is an organization that promotes good forestry practices through education and outreach. WRWA's diverse membership includes forest owners, managers, loggers, foresters, and others who appreciate the forest resources of southeastern Vermont and surrounding areas. Members have varied interests including timber, wildlife habitat, outdoor recreation, scenic beauty, and clean air and water. WRWA promotes the use of appropriate practices to foster the health and sustainability of our forest resources.

Our group was initially chartered in 1949 as the Woodland Owners Association. In 2014, we changed our name to Windham Regional Woodlands Association to better reflect that ownership is not a requirement of membership. However, we are all "owners" of the woodlands held in trust by local, state, and Federal governments. WRWA activities are open to anyone who wants to learn more about our forest resources. All who are interested in our activities are welcome to attend WRWA programs and become members.



Our activities include

Informational and educational meetings, field trips, and workshops on various aspects of woodland ecology and forest management

Woodlot Tips, a quarterly newsletter with informative articles and details about upcoming programs

Scholarships awarded to high school graduates who reside in Windham County and are pursuing college degrees in forestry or a related conservation field

Annual membership meeting that includes interesting speakers, a tour to demonstrate forest practices, and a potluck cookout

Courses on topics including forest management, control of invasive species, and chainsaw safety

Forestry resources library available to members

Collaboration with other natural resource organizations including Southern Vermont Audubon Society, Windham County Natural Resource Conservation District, Hogback Mountain Conservation Association, Vermont Coverts, Vermont Land Trust, Vermont Natural Resources Council, Vermont Woodlands Association, The Nature Conservancy, and Bonnyvale Environmental Education Center.
